






2 What did you learn about your student's/staff unique needs, strengths, and learning styles this year, and how will you use this knowledge to inform your teaching/leadership next year?




3 What were some of the most effective teaching/leading strategies or interventions you used this year, and how did they help your students/staff progress?




4 What were some areas where you struggled to meet the needs of your students/staff , and how will you work to improve in those areas next year?




5 How did you build positive relationships with your students, their families, and your colleagues this year, and what impact did those relationships have on your students'/staff learning and growth?




6 How did you incorporate technology into your teaching/leading this year, and how did it impact your students' engagement and learning outcomes?




7 How did you use data to inform your teaching/leadership and track your student's/staff progress this year, and what changes will you make to your data collection and analysis methods next year?
